

BC and Nova Scotia doubled it's male recipients during this fiscal year.



British Columbia 13 Newfoundland 1 Ontario 23

BC increased the number of women funded by 44% and Ontario increased the number of women funded by 9.5%, which is remarkable because of the introduction of IVF funding in the province.

\$68,940 disbursed to qualified patients in need, which is a 32% increase in funds disbursed from 2014-2015. This is in part, attributed to the increase in funding to female patients from \$1,500 to \$2,500 on a sliding scale.

Big news was made in December of 2015 when provincially funded IVF cycles were announced by the Ontario government. Fertile Future made efforts to adapt its **Power of Hope** Cost Reduction Program for Ontario residents. Some of these shifts include reimbursements for expenses incurred during IVF, such as a top up on drug costs (up to 25%), mileage, hotel and meals, all within specific guidelines. Compassionate drugs continue to be made available to Oncofertility patients by the pharmaceutical companies.

FUNDRAISING EVENTS

- **An Evening of Hope** in Toronto took place on October 29, 2015 at SteamWhistle Brewing for the third year in a row. This event raised **\$67,158**;
- An Evening of Hope in Vancouver had it's second year event on April 14, 2016 at the Fairmont Hotel Vancouver and outshone it's first year significantly by raising \$63,606;

Both Hope Live and the Capital Evening of Hope were postponed to the fall of 2016.

AWARENESS RAISING

Both Evening of Hope events in Toronto and Vancouver yielded a good amount of media coverage, including interviews with past recipient, Ashley Oscienny whose powerful story moved many attendees at the Vancouver event.

The **increase in funding** made available for women **from \$1,500 to \$2,500** also generated some news coverage with an article released by Global News in October, 2015.

STRATEGIC PLAN

The Board gathered in February to review the Fertile Future Strategic Plan for the 2016-2018 time frame. It was the first time the Board had formally met in person, thanks to funds provided by both AstraZeneca and Merck.

According to 2011 Canadian Cancer Statistics:

- 84,000 women and 93,000 men newly diagnosed each year
- 4200 women and 2500 men in reproductive age group
- 6500 childhood cancers diagnosed in Canada between 2003-2007
- Survival rates have greatly improved for many cancer subtypes with success rates of >80% reported in childhood cancers
- Long term survival issues such as future fertility are now receiving more consideration
- Cancer survivors identify loss of fertility as a major psychological stressor

Main priorities identified were:

- Increase recipients to 100/yr = 30% increase in recipients
- Increase funding for women by 50% = \$3,750 by 2018
- Communicate the impact and severity of potentially sterilizing oncology patients without letting them know of the risks
- Engage in Rebranding Project
- Increase High Profile Board Representation

- Increase Donors/ Sponsors/ Industry
- Create Alliances with Charities & Organizations Aligned with Fertile Future's Objectives
- Enhance Power of Hope Clinic Engagement
- Connect With Past recipients Survivorship and Legacy exposure
- Strengthen Partnerships with Pharmaceutical Companies
- Engage in Government Relations
